I only think gchs prepared me in the four main courses and I only ended up taking one math and two English's, for everything else I was prepared myself The school overall is more focused on getting kids the high test scores, rather than actually preparing them for real life. I know how to worth well with others in order to go far in life I was not overwhelmed at college at all. In fact it felt very much like taking my high school ap classes. no info on work force It gave me a good indication of college and how to prepare for it. I believe that QCHS did prepare me, however what they prepared me for isn't what I went to do. Classes prepared me in a way that was helpful in my college classes, it was an easy transition I believe I was prepared well enough in the knowledge I needed to know prior to my college courses, and I have nearly no complaints. I just wish that our classes in high school gave us more responsibility to learn the material ourselves because in some college classes I realized that the majority of learning is done outside of class. High school classes dont compare, and I wasn't prepared, in some ways, for the workload in college. Overall, yes it prepared me. However, there are areas that need improvement. Taking AP classes provided me with the work ethic and ability to excel in my honors courses in college. Also, the ample amount of extracurricular activities allowed me to discover my interests. Qcsd didnt help me with anything. I cant say i learned much of anything there. 6 months after graduating, i've never felt more unprepared for my life. Its like i didnt even go to school, im almost illiterate these days. I feel as if things should be focused on how it goes in the real world and not this fake world they portray it to be like. The main focus should be the understanding of things being taught not rushed for a standardized tests! I'm doing well at my current institution. Obviously, the college workload is different than your average high school student's; nonetheless, QCHS has aided me with my studies overall. My teachers inspired me to work hard. I also learned how to write and read efficiently in AP Literature senior year. AP AB Calculus also placed me in a higher math that I succeeded in getting an A in at college. QCHS gave me a good academic education in order to be prepared academically for college. However I was not prepared for living away at college, living in a city environment, and how to be independent. Those are things QCHS did not teach me. Qcsd has not spent time preparing students for their future! This school district would rather prepare students for standardized testing and end week quizzes. Honestly I did not dislike my experience, but it did little to prepare myself or my fellow students for what college or other real life work places are. It's hard to plan for the rigor of a university style education due to the variation in each professors teaching and the lack of necessary work comparing college to high school. I think all AP classes should assign more homework via online submission. The thing that most prepared me for college was definitely the AP classes I took. They were the only thing that semi resembles how college is going so far regarding course load. I believe that they did anything possible to open up experiences for all of us and explore secondary plans. I feel very behind in my math and science courses. I also learned nothing important about finance in high school that could help me. I am also struggling to study and ask for help in subjects since I wasn't taught how or when to. Yes QCHS prepared me for secondary plans, but I just wish they would educate us more on how to pay bills, pay taxes, balance checkbooks, achieve "good credit" etc. These are the things we will need to know during and post college education. College was so much different than high school we weren't prepared for any of it

I feel okay about everything content wise and how to dissect and interpret problems given to me, I just lack motivation to do them because of the fact that a revision system even exists.
